A Note from Liz Plachta, Executive Director and Her Most Important Job: Mama to Ruby and Ella Mae

Our annual Impact Report is our way of letting our community of donors and supporters know what we accomplished together in the past year—but 2020 was a very strange year, to say the least. As we reviewed the past months to determine the impact we'd had as an organization in 2020, we realized it may not make sense to apply the same standards as in previous years. People around the world were and still are struggling, and to this day, life in some ways is still on indefinite pause. Until life returns to something a little more normal, do metrics like how many of our scholarship recipients are enrolled in classes or working in their communities even apply?

It turns out they do, thanks to our endlessly inspiring Rockin' Recipients as well as our incredible community of supporters. Because of all of you, Ruby's Rainbow was able to make a profound impact in 2020.

And is it odd to say that while it was a tough year, it was one with some incredibly beautiful high points as well? Adjusting to pandemic life caused stress and worry for people around the globe, and it was the same for us at Ruby's Rainbow. Still, life went on in new ways, and like others, we figured out how to make things work, even when we had to do it from a distance.



We were very excited to welcome our first twins into the Ruby's Rainbow family this year identical twins, in fact! Bailee and Lynsey Richardson are rockin' it so far at Jefferson Community and Technical College!





Ruby helped me send out 81 congratulations letters and scholarship packets to our new Rockin' Recipients! This is one of her favorite jobs—you can see on her face just how much she loves it!! What inspired us most to keep on keepin' on? Our incredible Rockin' Recipients, who didn't let the pandemic keep them from learning or following their dreams. They adapted to online learning, social distancing and mask wearing as they continued working toward their higher-education goals.

We knew we couldn't let the pandemic get us down, either, or stop us from serving this incredibly worthy population. So, like just about everyone else on the planet, we pivoted, in many ways and as many times as we needed to.

Because of YOU—all of you—we are able to do what we do.

Our annual **3/21 Pledge** is held every March. 321 is a special number in the Down syndrome community, since it signifies Trisomy-21—the presence of a third copy of the 21st chromosome, which is also known as Down syndrome. That's why World Down Syndrome day falls on March 21 each year (3/21!), and why we named our biggest fundraiser of the year the 3/21 Pledge.


For 2020, we'd set our loftiest 3/21 Pledge goal ever, of raising \$321,000 and granting more scholarships than ever before. We kicked off the Pledge on a high note with our annual kickoff party hosted by Pride Socks, one of our incredible longtime partners—but by the time the Pledge culminated two weeks later, on World Down Syndrome Day, the world was on lockdown, and people everywhere were

suddenly uncertain about their jobs, their health, their finances and their futures.

And yet, you all showed up, just like you always do. You pitched in, pulled together and showed our incredible scholarship recipients just how much you believe in them. Through the two weeks of the Pledge, despite the sudden uncertainty making life feel precarious on almost every level, our community managed to raise an incredible \$276,000-an amount that sling-shotted us to a major milestone and beyond: As of 2020, with love and support from amazing people all over the world, we hit the \$1 million mark in scholarship funds granted since we first started doing this gig eight years ago. We have now officially awarded 387 scholarships to students with Down syndrome since 2012, totaling nearly \$1.2 million!!

It's you—YOU are Ruby's Rainbow!! It's only because of you, ALL of you, that we are able to do what we do.

I hope you know that what we're doing together is truly changing the world! Not just for our Rockin' Recipients and their families, classmates and coworkers, but for everyone. When the world is a more inclusive place, embracing of people's strengths and differences and accommodating of their needs and challenges, we all benefit.






Sophia Spizzirri

2020 Rockin' Recipient Judson University


Sophia is having a great college experience so far, and says, "I am really proud of myself because even though I really miss my family, I am doing things on my own and learning how to be more independent."

In 2020, Ruby's Rainbow granted 81 scholarships totaling \$276,000. This was awesome in itself, and it also brought our organization to a milestone that blows our minds in the best possible way: **Since 2012, we have granted 387 scholarships totaling \$1,186,000!!**

To think that we started out with the goal of granting just one \$2,000 scholarship, and have grown over the course of nine years to where we are today it seriously boggles the mind. And we could not have done a bit of it without the love and support of every single person who has ever followed us on social media, made a donation or helped us spread the word about the capabilities of the incredible, awe-inspiring adult students with Down syndrome whom we are so proud to help pursue their college dreams. So we hope you are feeling the pride along with our deepest gratitude!!

Our Rockin' Recipients are attending post-secondary programs at community colleges, colleges and universities across the country.

Of our 2020 scholarship recipients:

- Nine are attending Clemson University
- Four are attending Syracuse University
- Four are attending Judson University

- **Three** are attending Jefferson Community and Technical College
- **Three** are attending Ivy Tech Community College
- Two are attending Auburn University
- **Two** are attending Bethel University
- **Two** are attending the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs
- The other **52 recipients** are attending 46 other programs around the United States—in California, Oklahoma and Washington State; Arkansas, Ohio and Pennsylvania; Florida, Alabama and Missouri; and beyond.

About one-quarter of our Rockin' Recipients chose to defer their 2020 Ruby's Rainbow scholarships until 2021 due to concerns about the COVID-19 pandemic. The other three-quarters chose to continue their planned courses of study, either in person or via virtual learning. These programs are expensive due to the myriad supports in place for students with intellectual disabilities and learning differences, including mentors and advisors, assistive technology, on-campus support centers, and more.

Ruby's Rainbow offers scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000. Notably, our scholarships are among the few available to students with Down syndrome that do not set minimum eligibility requirements for recipients' course hours. This means we serve a diverse group of students—some who take full course loads (three to five courses per semester), others who focus on just one course at a time, and still others in between. This enables us to truly value differentiated learning and serve students exactly where they are.
